


Thinking about this reminded me of these verses from the Epistle of James; in chapter 1 we read:

¹⁹ My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, ²⁰ because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. ²¹ Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you. ²² Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like.

Perhaps there are things in each of our lives that we need to recognise do not belong there and need to be removed. Maybe those character traits or actions that cause hurt to other people or to ourselves. Therefore as we move into a new Connexional year let us all clear out the old and focus on our and hope for the future.

Keswick Methodist Church Redevelopment and Fundraising

As a result of the stop press news about the £100,000 grant in the last issue the redevelopment group met and decided that, in spite of an inflation increase of about £20,000, it would be wise to wait till August 2017, immediately after the Convention, to start the work.

This takes the pressure off our fundraisers as it allows more time for grant applications to be made and processed. We say thank you to Richard who continues to toil away at the application forms. This delay will allow us to have a more certain financial picture before work starts. But the fundraising still goes on apace.

Most recently we've had the Convention Refreshments and the Knitted Bible Stories Exhibition, two quite different events. Our thanks go out to all those who baked, made soup, welcomed people, served visitors and talked to them.

Both of these events slotted into the church's vision of welcoming and hospitality and visitors' comments emphasised how well we did. Comments such as 'very welcoming', 'friendly', 'best coffee in Keswick', and 'much appreciated by Conventioners' were just some of the compliments received.

Many people also showed interest in our Vision 21 and this was reflected in nearly £500 of donations over the 4 weeks. Convention refreshments took over £3,000 and the Knitted Bible refreshments over £400. Fundraising item sales realised over £1,250 during the Convention and nearly £250 during the Knitted Bible Exhibition.

Expenses for the four weeks are difficult to pin down exactly because of using previously held goods and having some left over for future church use, but were about £800.

The four weeks, while being hard work for those involved, were profitable financially but, more importantly, was the church fulfilling the vision which God has given us. If you missed out in helping over the summer, then future opportunities will arise.

Future events:

By the time you read this Sheila and Keith will have welcomed us to their garden on **23 August** - more details next time. (Which proved to be a lovely sunny afternoon, enjoyed by all who were able to make it, including the garden Treasure Hunt, and the lovely strawberry and cream scones! ed.)

11 September is our next big event with the Theatre show 'Behind the Mask' at 7.30pm. We're very appreciative of all the work and time Katie Dalzell and her three friends are putting in to perform this for our benefit.

As God's people for whom this performance is happening we have a responsibility to ensure the theatre is full. Are you displaying posters? Are you encouraging businesses with whom you have contacts to display a poster? Are you encouraging your family friends (particularly in community groups you belong to) to buy tickets? We should be publicising this event as much as possible and using it as an opportunity to share our faith.

Further in the future we've booked the Ayrton Brothers for an evening of Gospel Music on **Friday 11 November** at 7.30pm. More details will appear later but please book the date now and start mentioning it to friends.

And don't forget the Fundraising Stall in the Grisedale Room where you can get your Picture Hunt (all within ½ mile of church), 2017 calendar, recipe book, I♥KESWICK bag, cards, quiz and puddings! A new stock of puddings, including Plum Puddings, will be arriving early September.

The five practices that we shall be exploring are:

Radical Hospitality
Passionate Worship
Intentional Faith Development
Risk-taking Mission and Service
Extravagant Generosity

We also hope to have a Christmas musical evening with Helen North introducing us to some new Christmas songs (as well as some familiar favourites) and another speaker talking to us about how their faith has shaped their life.
