Fairtrade Wine & Cheese Evening: Tuesday 28 February 7.30-9pm

Keswick Fairtrade Campaign have arranged, with the help of the Fairtrade Foundation, for Marthe Uwihewenimana, a coffee farmer from Ruanda, to come to Cumbria for Fairtrade Fortnight. Marthe will be fully occupied travelling around organisations and schools in both North and South Cumbria to speak about her work as a Fairtrade coffee farmer. The cooperative in which she is involved was set up after the genocide that took place over twenty years ago to give women who had been widowed some independence. Marthe is also a mother of 11 children. In addition she is a teacher - a very busy lady! Find out more at the Café by the Lake - cost £7.50 covers the cost of the Fairtrade wine and local cheese and will offset some of the cost associated with the visit. Soft drinks will be provided for those who prefer it. French speakers will be especially welcome as that is Marthe's native language. More details on the poster.

**Women's World Day of Prayer: Friday 3 March

Am I Being Unfair to You?

On Friday 3 March over 5,000 services will be held in the British Isles on the theme of **Am I Being Unfair to You?** The Christian women of the Philippines wrote the service and it has been translated into 1,000 different languages and dialects, to be used, throughout the whole world, on Friday 3 March, starting at sunrise over the island of Samoa and continuing until sunset off the coast of American Samoa.

In 2013, Typhoon Haiyan – named locally as 'Yolanda' – struck the Philippine islands in the western Pacific ocean. This is mentioned in the service but you will also hear the stories of a girl, a mother and an older woman, recounting their situations and their hopes and fears. The service focusses on the Bible story of the workers in the vineyard: Matthew 20:1–16. There is a reflection on the artwork designed by Rowena 'Apol' Laxamana-Sta.Rosa. It is thought-provoking and illustrates contrasting scenes.

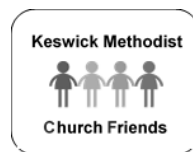

East Africa Famine Appeal

South Sudan is the first nation in six years to declare a famine, but the UN have issued a stark warning that other countries face extreme food-shortages across East Africa. **All We Can** and the **World Church Relationships Team** of the Methodist Church in Britain are calling for support for an urgent appeal to respond to immediate needs in South Sudan and to help avert famine in other countries on the verge of disaster. Ongoing food crises have pushed many East African countries to the brink of catastrophe with millions across the region facing malnutrition, illness and death.



On 20 February 2017 it was announced that South Sudan had already reached tipping point with two counties being declared as officially affected by famine. Droughts and unpredictable rainfall, protracted civil conflicts and entrenched economic crises, have led to widespread food insecurity across East Africa and people are already dying. Without urgent support, many other communities across the region face the threat of famine in 2017.

The Methodist Church in Britain are urging people to respond quickly, generously and collectively to this catastrophic situation by supporting the appeal being managed by **All We Can**.
