
• Harvest Lunch

Setting up the Hall for Worship

South Asia Floods Appeal

Christian Aid has launched an appeal for the South Asia floods. An estimated 1,200 lives have been lost, while survivors' homes



and livelihoods have been destroyed. Hundreds of thousands of people have been evacuated from the worst hit areas and are living in temporary shelters. Christian Aid's partners in India, Nepal and Bangladesh are helping people whose homes and crops have been lost. They are providing safe drinking water, hygiene materials, tarpaulin and ground sheeting for shelters, and mosquito nets. They are also educating survivors on good hygiene practices to limit the spread of water-borne diseases, such as cholera. There will be a retiring collection for the appeal this week. The collection point is in the parlour where you came in. If you wish to gift aid your donation there are appeal envelopes available.



Sainsbury's ditches Fairtrade

Sainsbury's is the largest retailer of Fairtrade products in the UK. But they've decided to drop the Fairtrade Mark from their own-brand tea and replace it with their own 'Fairly Traded' label instead. Sainsbury's has abandoned Fairtrade certification to set up its own pilot scheme, saying they want to secure their supply chain. 'Fairly Traded' sounds a lot like Fairtrade, but it doesn't have the same gold standards. It is self-run by Sainsbury's but most importantly it takes control away from tea farmers. The new scheme is untested, unverified and unwanted and the 'Fairly Traded' label is likely to mislead customers. If you can, please sign the email petition urging Sainsbury's to reconsider.
